








A New Temple with No Walls

Eph 2:13-16

But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made the two groups one and has destroyed the barrier, the dividing wall of hostility, by setting aside in his flesh the law with its commands and regulations.

Eph 2:13-16

His purpose was to create in himself one new humanity out of the two, thus making peace, and in one body to reconcile both of them to God through the cross, by which he put to death their hostility.

Three Lessons

- 3. In Christ, we are being built to become a Holy Temple wherein God lives.

1. In Christ, we should have no walls of alienation and separation among us (Vs. 11-13).


 Walls in our hearts are more dangerous than the physical walls we erect against others.

1. The Wall of Pride (Identity or privilege)


- Separates people
